Boston Tea Party

The Boston Tea Party took place in Boston Harbor on December 16, 1773. The American colonists did not have a voice for how their taxes were used. Therefore, they did not want to pay their taxes because they believed it to be unfair. They were strongly united in this matter, and as a result they dumped boxes of tea into the harbor, a product very important in their daily lives. Samuel Adams led the Patriots who boarded three British ships. Once they boarded the ships, three groups of 50 men who posed as Mohawk Native Americans broke open the tea crates and threw them overboard. As news of this rebellion spread, other groups of Patriots conducted similar types of rebellions around the countryside.
